Workshops

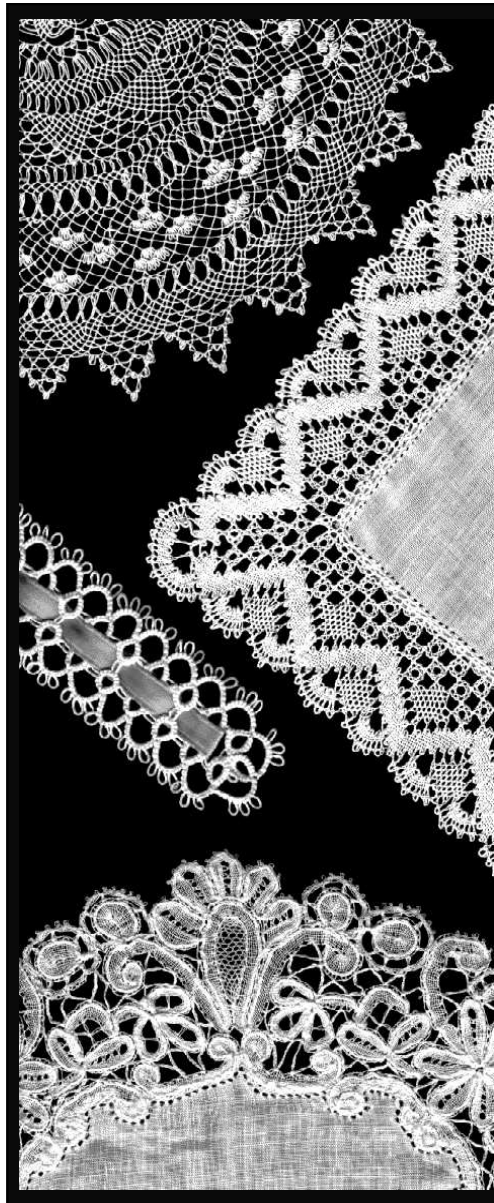
Workshops are held periodically during the year. Teachers from the U.S. and Europe conduct classes in all types of laces for students of all levels.
