IPSWICH CLASS IN ALEXANDRIA

Ipswich lace is an historic American lace based on 22 black silk bobbin lace samples made in Ipswich, MA, in 1789-1790 and preserved in the Library of Congress. In 1791 Alexander Hamilton received 22 samples of black silk and 14 white linen lace edgings from Ipswich, Massachusetts representing lacemaking as the most important industry in the town of Ipswich. Karen has studied the black lace samples in detail and made patterns and working diagrams for each of these historic samples and published them in The Lace Samples from Ipswich, Massachusetts 1789-1790.
