## Featured Speaker Allie Marguccio

Idrija lace, a bobbin lace named for the Slovenian town where it is made, features graceful meandering ribbons of clothwork which are joined by extended twisted threads. Teacher Allie Marguccio (pictured) is a descendant of several generations of Slovenian lace makers. She decided she had to carry on this family tradition after a visit from a European cousin in 1979, who brought her bobbins and pillow along, and introduced her to lace making. Allie has studied traditional Slovenian lace making techniques under Metka Fortuna, director of the Idrija Lace School in Idrija, and Master Teacher Stana Frelih. She teaches private classes at her home in Pennsylvania and has taught numerous workshops throughout the United States.

# Idrija Lace Jewelry Class

May 15 and 16, 2021

*Once you've heard her speak, you'll want to join Allie's next class.*

During the two 3-hour sessions, students will make a necklace introducing them to Idrija techniques. The necklace can be made by lace makers of all levels. When finished, it can be attached to a wire or cord and worn as a necklace or be applied to the neck of a crew top.



Students will learn how to make 5-pair narrow tape, double and four-way joins, how to make a gentle curve without pins, how to attach beads (which is done differently from other laces), how to make a pointed corner, and two of the most common starts and endings used in Idrija lace.

**Equipment:** The workshop will be conducted via Zoom. Students should have available a laptop, desktop, table or iPad for watching demonstrations and a second device mounted above their work surface so that the instructor can see the student's work.

**Cost:** \$80.00. The cost includes the supply kit. The supply kit includes: (1) the pattern and diagram, (2) pattern instructions, and (3) one spool of Idrija cotton thread #30 in the student's choice of color. Idrija cotton thread is machine washable (delicate setting) and does not shrink.
